

STEP 1 - Collect the correct tools. For best results, we suggest you gather at least the most basic tools you will need to complete assembly. While you may find more tools that will help you achieve outstanding results, we suggest you start with the following: Hot glue gun, scissors, variety of water based colored markers, tweezers, straight edge rulers, hobby knife, instant setting high strength hobby glue Plus 4ea, Hot Glue Sticks



STEP 3 - With appropriate color markers, detail the edges of all the parts you cut out. This will result in a finely finished project once assembled.

Cut out all components and place in a safe area and place all parts in a tray so you do not lose any.



STEP 2 - Empty contents of the kit, carefully cut out all the individual parts to be assembled with a Scissors. The most precise cuts you can make will result in a dramatically better looking finished project. Use smooth long scissor strokes on the bigger parts.

STEP 4 - Scoring. Using a Hobby Knife (see picture) and a straight-edge ruler, apply lighter Blade pressure onto the marked fold line on the part you wish to fold. Scoring along these lines to be bent makes bending all printed parts easier, and results in a much cleaner looking fold. Bend parts using the length of your straightedge ruler or a desk edge Scoring is an essential skill. Practice on Scrap piece.





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
TIP: Look Ahead At All Photos For Extra Guidance



STEP 5 - With scale building kits, there is usually no correct place to begin. In this case, we'll start by prepping the fruit and vegetable crates. Score all the white lines, then fold the tabs in to a box. Glue the tabs together with hot glue. Put crates on the side for display later.



STEP 8 - Now pick out 6 farmers market roofs. I choose the same amount of colors that matched with my shelfs I picked out in step 7. Once they are picked out score the white line. Fold slightly downward, like shown above. And put aside




STEP 11 - Once the farmers market is prepped, grab the sticks that are included in the kit. For each stand we need one shorter set and one longer set of sticks. The shorter sticks go on the front inner part of the walls and the longer ones go on the inner back edge part. For the longer sets you need to cut 0.75 or 3/4 off. And for the shorter sticks you need to cut $1 \frac{1}{2}$ off. 12 shorter sticks and 12 longer sticks. When gluing the sticks on the inside parts of the walls, make sure it is flat against the wall so they do not interfer with the shelfs later on. Use hot glue.






STEP 6 - After grab the optional farmers market signs. Score the middle white line and fold the top sign downwards on to each other. Place a small amount of hot glue between them. Or you can just make a stand out of them. You can place them anywhere later. I glued the smaller sign on top of the middle farmers market roof. Put aside for later.



STEP 9- Then pick 6 of the farmers market stands. Cut a small slit on the bottom white lines on both sides, stop cutting once your about to hit the wood. Look above to see the blue line to know where to cut exactly. Score the two white lines on a walls sides, including the bottom horizontal white line. Then fold the small bottom tabs inward flat from the ground. And fold the sides of the walls inwards 90 degrees. Make sure before securing that the side bottom tabs are folded on top on the inside like shown above in the circled areas. Use hot glue.



STEP 12 - Place the shelfs on to the inside top part of the walls, use hot or white glue to secure. Use the small tab. Then gather the add ons for the shelfs. Score the white lines and the small gray tabs on the veggies, bread, and fruit. Have fun and place them on any shelf you like, layer them so they look fuller.



Step 7 - Next pick out 6 farmers market shelfs, I recommend picking a variety of styles. For an example, some empty shelfs, fruits, veggies, different colors. After you picked 6 shelfs score the white line on them. Then fold them 90 degrees downward from the top of the shelf. The small tab will be used as glue tab when the walls are assembled. And put aside.



Step 10 - Next grab all of the bases. Place them evenly inside of the walls we assembled in step 9. Place a small amount of hot or white alue on the bottom sides of the walls to secure the base to. Hold until dry.



STEP 13 - Here are two examples of the add ones on the shelfs. You can also use the black signs to label your farmers market stands. Be creative.



STEP 14 - Lastly apply the roofs to any framers market stand you assembled. The front of a roof is where the small slanted flab is. Place a small amount of hot glue underneath the roof to glue on to the sticks. After all the stands have roofs, glue the stands on to the small bases located on the main base. Any placement you desire. You can use the imagine on the left as a reference.
